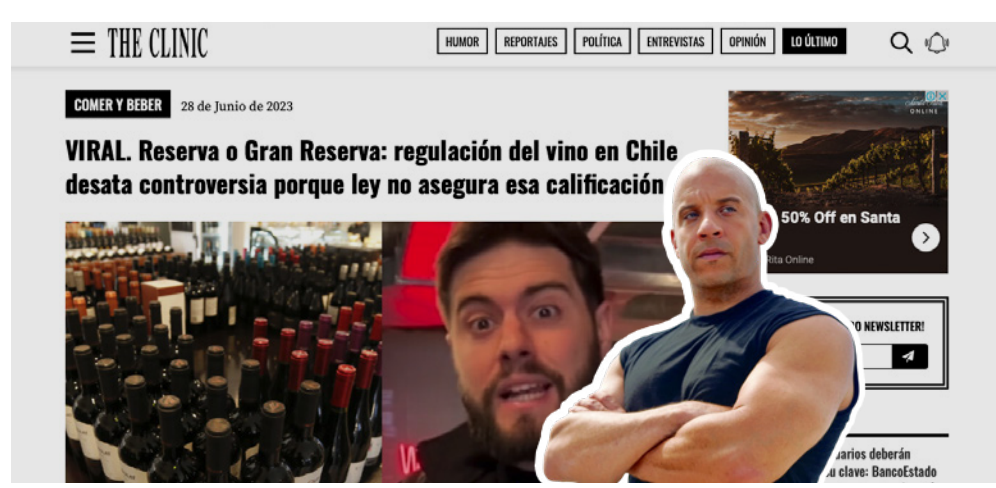
INDIAN MOTORCYCLES & FORAJIDOS WINES IN CURACARIBS
