FORAJIDO OF THE MONTH: RYAN HUGHES

Every now and then you meet people who really don't follow the trends, don't fit in with the establishment and challenge the status quo. Those who challenge their own limits, grow every day and transform their passions into their daily activities, positively impacting others.

We call these people Outliers.

Ryan Hughes, supercross and motocross legend, professional competitor between 1990 and 2005, also raced MXGP in Europe, represented the USA several times in the MX of Nations and won multiple races. After his retirement, he became a trainer of professional riders, and created, together with Ryan McCarthy, Ryno Power.



A very famous episode in the career of "Ryno" was the MX of Steel City in 1995, when his chain was cut in the last curve of the last race of the season, losing the title of champion of that year.

But despite this, he pushed his bike several meters up the hill to make it to the finish line, winning 2nd place. This reflected and positioned Ryan as a rider with unmatched inner strength and discipline.

Ryan, from where all that passion for the sport comes from, showing that strength and attitude that is almost unique in motocross history?

My passion for the sport comes from my love of the sport you know I've always ridden a motorcycle, but once I started racing the thrill and the excitement and the challenge made my passion even stronger. Being able to do it solo like it's all on me - if I lose, it's on my shoulders. If I win, it's on my shoulders. Again, I've never come across anything so exciting and challenging as motocross so that brings a lot of passion for it.

What makes a great pilot? Talent or hard work?

What will make a good rider is #1, talent, you know because when someone is talented they could ride the bike with much ease... but you can't just go off talent. You have to go off hard work. So if you can combine talent and hard work, well then, you have a masterpiece. Some people have talent but don't work hard - some people work hard but don't have talent - so if you can mix the both, then you have a winner on the bike.

The sport has evolved a lot, from 2 strokes to 4 strokes, faster bikes in faster tracks. But the technique on the bike, has evolved according to The accord.

Yes, the sport has evolved a lot as you see the bikes are changing - it's a lot of evolution. The tracks are changing - I brought a little bit easier so the speeds are up and the technique has evolved with the sport as well. I thought a new technique into the sport in 2000s are when the four strokes started making an impact, I think with the four strokes plus the tracks and a new technique, you're seeing a new level of speed and intensity in our sport.

What would you recommend to a weekend warrior who wants to start racing?

If a weekend warrior wants to race in one he needs to be taught properly because now you're not racing yourself you're racing against other people and sometimes it's easier to ride in your head than when you're riding with other people so being skilled is very important. Another thing is making sure that you're fit - you know. Making sure you're fit is being well so when you go to the track you can handle the distance of the Moto. Make sure you're sharp, and leading a healthy lifestyle, other than that, you know, just have fun and try not to race with your ego.

How do you manage the balance between a spiritual life, passion for the sport, hard training, and races??

Doing you manage the balance in life is kind of like tightening the spokes on a wheel, you have to torque every spoke with the same amount of torque or you can have a wobbly wheel and you can have a wobbly life so everything needs to be paid attention to. You need to pay attention to the quiet time to yourself. You need to pay attention to your training, if you're gonna be racing also pay attention to your lifestyle, and your family, so everything needs attention but nothing needs more and nothing needs less if everything can be met with the same torque well then life will start moving a lot smoother instead of you always having hiccups.
